David Saks' colorful underwater photography uses a digital SLR with an underwater housing and strobes to reveal an intimate view of ocean life. "I want people to see what may be lost through our negligence, lack of understanding, and refusal to believe facts. Coastal oil drilling, general pollution and global warming all kill phytoplankton, the sea creatures that are the smallest forms of life. These in turn feed larger life forms. In short, human life depends on the health of the oceans through the foods we eat and even the air we breathe," stated Saks.
